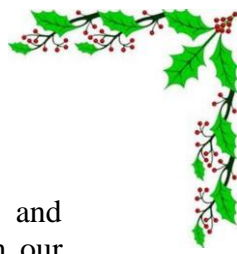


## *MERRY CHRISTMAS*
