
Shared Pregnancy Reaches Out To The Knights of Columbus


Grand Knight Jay G. Corey recently received an email from Soraya Nowland, New Life Center Volunteer, thanking them and council 788 for it's participation with the installation of three new Ultrasound Machines in the Lansing area pregnancy centers in the past two years.

She indicated in her email that she also viewed an amazing video put out by the Knights of Columbus nationally, viewed at Washington DC March for Life in front of over 500,000 people, and aired on EWTN live broadcast that day. The Knights of Columbus have installed their 1,000th ultrasound machine.

PRAISE GOD !! The amount of lives that have been saved due to those ultrasound machines is HUGE. Shared Pregnancy mentions in their news that 595 ultrasounds (up 22% this year) were performed. 85% of their clients that receive an ultrasound choose life. I realize many of your members may not have been able to watch the March for Life Rally held on Friday, January 18th, so I wanted to let you know again how grateful we are for your organization.

The Knights of Columbus were also acknowledged in their newsletter entitled 2018 Year In Review. The title of the article was An Amazing Life-Saving Gift. The article indicated that the highlight of our year was receiving a new state-of the-art Samsung ultrasound machine to replace our outdated machine. With 85% of clients choosing life after getting an ultrasound, it's clear that an ultrasound is a powerful factor in the decision for life. The Knights of Columbus St. Therese of Lisieux #11957 donated \$17,594 and the Supreme Knights of Columbus Council matched this amount. Samsung sells the machine for \$75,914 but allowed us to purchase it for \$35,188. The advanced technology of this new machine, with a clearer picture and 3D option, helps women see their tiny baby with more clarity than before. On November 28th, board members, staff, friends and Knights councilmen celebrated and dedicated the ultrasound machine with a ribbon-cutting ceremony. We thank God for bringing about this miracle and the Knights of Columbus for this amazing, generous and timely gift!
