New Knights Degree Combines Charity, Unity & Fraternity

After 142 years, the Knights of Columbus is pulling down the veil of secrecy that has surrounded its initiation ceremonies in an effort to better showcase the orders core principles and its drive to help Catholic men become disciples. Since its founding, the initiation ceremonies for the first three degrees of Knights of Columbus membership which are focused on the principles of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity have been separate and open to members only. The Fourth Degree, dedicated to the principle of Patriotism, was added later and is also secret.

Beginning in January 2020, Knights of Columbus have adopted a new ceremony called the Exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity which combines the initiation for a new members first three degrees into a single ceremony that will be open to family, friends, and fellow parishioners. Young men today often find secrecy unnecessary, and those features have proven over time to be an impediment to men joining, particularly young men. The new degree pulls from the three previous ceremonies to pass along the history of the order and the importance of the principles of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity.

The new single ceremony takes less than 30 minutes, which will allow more councils to have their own ceremonial team and have more degrees more often. The degree is able to be read from a podium and will take five members to put on dressed in business suits or sport jackets and ties.

These degrees can be held in the council hall, or conducted in a church with a priest or deacon participating. With the shorter time frame, they can be done right after a mass with members of the church congregation looking on along with the families of the member joining. By opening the ceremony up to anyone wanting to view it, everyone can see what the Knights of Columbus are all about and hopefully decide that I, my brother, or my husband should join.

It is hoped that this change will encourage members to ask a non-member to join and hopefully acquire younger men to join this great fraternal organization within the Catholic Church.






FATHER GABRIEL RICHARD

Father Gabriel Richard, First Catholic Priest in Congress

A few years after the war of 1812 ended, Fr. Richard turned his attention to the renovation of his parish, particularly the building of a new Ste. Anne's Church. The cornerstone of the fifth church structure in the parish's history was laid on June 11, 1818, exactly 13 years after the devastating fire in Detroit. It was going to be a costly and lengthy building project, especially considering many of Ste. Anne's parishioners were still recovering financially from the recent conflict.



To offset the costs of construction, Fr. Richard took on a new endeavor of service. He ran for political office, in particular as a non-voting representative of the Territorv the U.S. of Michigan to House of Representatives. Ste. Anne's pastor promised to devote his new salary toward the construction of the church. His political opponent, prominent Detroit citizen John R. Williams, attempted to persuade Fr. Richard that he was unfit for the office. "Believe me," Williams wrote, "you have talent for preaching the Gospel — hold to it - and to the French language - and you will assuredly will be useful to many good Christians. But I do not believe you will be able to get into the House of Representatives at Washington where they speak only English."

Father Richard was elected as a nonvoting delegate of the Michigan Territory to the U.S. House of Representatives for the 18th Congress, and was the first Catholic priest to be elected to that body, and was readily accepted as an esteemed member of Congress, serving a single term of 1823-1825. During his one term of service Fr. Richard defended the educational rights of Native Americans and secured the first federal appropriation for a road across Michigan's Lower Peninsula in March 1824. A year later, the road was established in federal law, and it was surveyed by the end of 1825. Construction started in 1829, and the road was finished across Michigan in 1833; it was developed as Michigan Avenue, connecting Detroit with Chicago.

Fr. Richard was an unsuccessful candidate for reelection in 1824, being succeeded by Austin Eli Wing, a member of the Whig Party. True to his promise, Fr. Richard's emolument payments from his brief political career went to the construction of Ste. Anne's. The upper portion of the church was finally completed in the late 1820s.






