#### A Message From Your LCA President

Thanks to everyone who has sent their donation to the building fund. We have 77 members who have contributed to date, and it would be great to have 100% participation. If you haven't sent in a donation yet, I ask that you please give it some heartfelt thought and contribute soon. Special thanks to the Ladies Auxiliary for their contribution to our building fund, and it is wonderful to have such a great working partnership.

The board has set up a separate account for the building fund to keep the money segregated from our operating account. We are treating this money as restricted money, using it only for debt reduction and building repairs. I have been asked how the building fund money will be spent. Already, the board has discussed the various work needed around the club. We had a blower motor, relay switch and capacitor that needed to be replaced on one of our air conditioning units, which is something we could not ignore with the summer heat coming soon. So that work was contracted out and is completed.

The board also voted to repair some of the outside lights on the east side of the building, as two of the lights on the east side were not working. The board also wanted to upgrade the lights on the east side of the building to LED lighting. This work has now been completed. The board also voted to change the rest of the parking lot lights over to LED which will result in a cost saving manor over time. The ones that can be reached from ladders have been changed out and the ones on the light poles have been contracted out. The recessed lighting in the bar area has been switched to LED and the lights in the rental area will be switched out to LED. Some of that work will be contracted and some of it will be done by the board or Monica Bergstrom our club manager.

The payback on the switching to LED lighting is about 2.5 years and the money saved every month will be placed in the building fund. The board is also working diligently to pay off our debt, and once that is retired we will be placing additional money in the building fund every month.

Now, we still need more donations to our building fund as we have only reached 4% of our goal. The board has reviewed bids to perform repairs and seal cracks on the parking lot. These are deemed as necessary and the bids are around \$5,000 to \$6,000. The board is hoping to get more donations to complete this repair.

My thanks to everyone who came out in the damp weather on Saturday, May19th and helped clean up the outside of the building. We were able to clean the outside, clean the grill, and get the patio furniture out for the summer season. A special thank you to Club Manager Monica Bergstrom and her husband Drew who also helped us with this project.

#### Plan Now For The Diocesan Eucharistic Procession

Individuals, families, parish groups and ministries are being encouraged to plan now for participating in the September  $22^{nd}$  Eucharistic Procession that is being organized to fill the Breslin Center on that date.

Bishop Earl Boyea will celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and concelebrated by nearly all of the priests of the diocese on that date. There will be NO masses on Saturday afternoon at the parishes in the diocese on September 22<sup>nd</sup>. Plans call for a procession that will journey from St. Mary's Cathedral in Lansing to the Breslin Center in East Lansing beginning at 9:00 am in the morning and arriving at the Breslin Center at 11:30 am. This four mile journey expresses our love for Christ in the Real Presence of the Eucharist by publicly honoring Him. It is hoped that well over 10,000 Catholics will be a part of this program arriving at the Breslin Center with the assembly gathering with inspiring speakers from 1:00 pm to 4:30 pm. The all diocesan mass will begin at 4:30 pm and is scheduled to end at 6:30 pm.

Parking is available at the Breslin Center at a cost of \$10.00 for the day. Free bus transportation from the Breslin Center to St. Mary's will be provided starting at 7:00 am. Parishes, parish schools, and ministries are invited to participate as groups with t-shirts, banners and flags. You can join in for the full procession, a part of it, or view it remotely at the Breslin Center where the procession will be broadcast live. Bishop Boyea is hoping that this will be a historic event in our diocese with a day of celebration, witness and worship together.

The Knights of Columbus will be a vital part of this event including our 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Honor Guard and many of our State Dignitaries will also be participating in the procession and days activities. Throughout the morning and afternoon of this gathering at the Breslin Center, attendees will have access to the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the opportunity to view several religious displays and take advantage of a variety of Catholic vendors and ministries. Fun activities for young children will be available and professional childcare will be offered free of charge during select times in the afternoon. Concession stands will be open for those who wish to purchase meals on site.
