A Brief History of Catholic Priests in Congress



There have been only three Catholic priests who have served as members of Congress. Fr. Gabriel Richard was the first and since Michigan was a Territory, not yet a State, he was a nonvoting member from 1823-1825. It would be 146 years until another Catholic priest would be elected to Congress. The other two priests are the Rev. Robert F. Drinan of Massachusetts and the Rev. Robert John Cornell of Wisconsin, both of whom served in the 1970's. The reason there will probably not be any other priests as members of Congress is explained below.

The Rev. Robert F. Drinan, a Jesuit priest from Massachusetts, served as a Democratic member of the House of Representatives from 1971 to 1981. During his decade as a legislator, Drinan was the first member of Congress to introduce a resolution calling for President Richard M. Nixon to be impeached; he did so in 1973, after the secret bombing of Cambodia ordered by Nixon came to light. Drinan had run on an anti-Vietnam War platform and also supported abortion rights, which some scholars have speculated may have been a factor in the change to canon law on priests holding public office.



The Rev. Robert John Cornell served in Congress concurrently with Fr. Drinan for two terms from 1975 to 1979. They were the only two priests to serve as voting members of Congress served at the same time.



Robert John Cornell was born on Dec. 16, 1919, in Gladstone, MI and ordained a Roman Catholic priest in the Norbertine Order in Wisconsin. Fr. Cornell served two terms in Congress, from 1975 to 1979, but lost his seat in the 1978 election. Fr. Cornell served on the Veterans Affairs Committee, where he fought hard for former members of the military, sometimes to the annoyance of other committee members. In 1978 Fr. Cornell lost his reelection bid. While "the enlightened electorate" sent him to Washington D.C. in 1974 "to set things straight," Cornell wrote, "My constituents decided that I had completed my work after four years."

Fr. Drinan dropped his re-election bid in 1980 after St. John Paul II, who was then pope, announced that priests would no longer be allowed to hold political office. Under the Code of Canon Law that was in force at the time, Catholic priests were able to hold public office with the permission of church officials. In 1983, the Vatican officially revised canon law to say that "Clerics are forbidden to assume public offices which entail a participation in the exercise of civil power."

Fr. Cornell pulled out of the race in 1980 for the 8th District House seat in Wisconsin after St. John Paul II's decision. In announcing his withdrawal from the race, Cornell said: "It is my personal belief that serving in Congress is no more inconsistent with the priesthood than teaching government and history, as I have done for 35 years."

Purpose: To award one time educational grants to new members.

Amount of Grants and Awards: All selected applications will be awarded a onetime grant of \$500. If a new member's male relative also joins, the grant will increase to \$600. All \$600 grants will be awarded on first application received basis. If grant funds remain, additional awards will be made on the same basis. We will begin accepting applications on March 2, 2020 but no later than March 16, 2020. If we receive more applications on the same date that cannot be filled based on funding limitations, awards will be based on additional information on why you should receive an award. Please feel free to attach this to your application, but it is not required at this time. Please limit to 200 words.

Who Qualifies: Any new member who is pursuing an educational program which includes any college program, apprenticeship, trade school program or others as deemed appropriate by the council program committee. The number of grants awarded will be dependent on the number of applications received and funding available.

What are the requirements to join the Knights of

Columbus? Membership is open to men 18 years of age or older who are practical (that is, practicing) Catholics. A practical Catholic accepts the teaching authority of the Catholic Church on matters of faith and morals, aspires to live in accord with the precepts of the Catholic Church, and is in good standing in the Catholic Church.

How to Join: All candidates will join through the online process. At that time all candidates will participate in the induction process which takes approximately 30 minutes. After completion you will be processed into our local council.

What are the membership dues/fees for members who join online? All dues will be paid by us for the first year. Online Membership dues are currently \$30.00 per year.

Steps to apply: Complete attached application. Submit to John Suckow, 10545 Saddlebrook Dr., Grand Ledge Michigan 48837 starting on March 2, 2020 but no later than March 16, 2020. Applications mailed will be considered received by the post mark date. Applications may also be dropped off in person. No email or text applications will be accepted.
