Peter Omogo's brother passed away as a young man. It supplies water wells in Nigeria which we support). Ultrasound initiatives. The White Lake Giving Tree (food and presents at Christmas) and more.

Supporting our seminarians, and our priest. Feeding the hungry, clothing the children, supporting Right to Life, giving water wells to Nigerans and food and presents to those struggling at Christmas.

We have had St. James Fish Fry's for more than 30 years.

### 3e) Describe the success of the program:

This year was especially challenging with the COVID pandemic. We were not able to serve our parishioners and community in our church hall, so we had to learn how to sell dinners via "Curbside Pickup". The success came from our Fish Fry leadership, Tom and Carol Bart and their team of 67 Fish Friers that rallied behind them every week for 7 Friday nights during Lent. (We started one week early.)

On Friday, April 2, 2021, ABC's WZZM TV 13 in Grand Rapids, announced that St. James had won 1<sup>st</sup> Place in the West Michigan Fish Fry Frenzy.

The St. James Lenten Fish fry has been a part of the St. James parish for well over 35 years. Back when it started, it was led by parishioners and served maybe 100 – 200 people per night in the church basement. At that time the Fish Fry helped to financially support the St. James Catholic School and did so for many years. The Fish Fry has since moved out of the basement and into the new church hall.

For roughly the last decade, the Fish Fry has been led the Knights of Columbus, Our Lady of White Lake Council 12985. It retains the name of "St. James" Fish Fry because the volunteers are KC members, Knights Auxiliary, St. James's parishioners and members of the community. This is a dedicated group of people who come back every year, take up their positions, and deliver another year of good fish dinners.

In recent years, prior to the COVID pandemic, St. James has served as many as 1,003 dinners on a Friday night, which included take-out dinners.

The Fish Fry revenue supports many charities, including: LOVE Inc, No More Sidelines, White Lake Food Pantry, Helping Hands Food Pantry, Holy Cross Children's Services, White Lake Giving Tree, Right to Life, Muskegon Pregnancy Services, St. Mary's of the Woods Baby Pantry, Prison and Jail Ministry, John Loss Seminarian Fund, Catechism for High School Graduates, Parish Youth Programs and many more.

Tom Bart is our current Fish Fry Director. Tom and his wife Carol order all the supplies, coordinate all of the help and with the help of Knight John Horning, ensure the electronic payment system is working. Tom took over this responsibly about 4 years ago and is the right person for the task. He has a business sense of how to operate the Fish Fry, and he works well with his volunteer crew - which he fondly calls his "Fish Friers". His wife Carol is the computer, books, internet, and email manager. She and Tom have written a Fish Fry procedure, to ensure a good hand-off to the next Fish Fry director someday.

Last year's Fish Fry was cut short due to the COVID pandemic in March 2020. We served dinners at only three Lenten Fridays and the last 3 dinners were cancelled due to COVID. This really reduced our annual revenue stream. Therefore, it was especially important that we have a successful Fish Fry in 2021.

Tom formed a planning committee and quickly realized this Fish Fry was going to be an outdoor "Curbside" pickup. To do this, communication was sent out to the community to place fish dinner orders online with a designated 'pick-up' time. Tom set up a team to monitor and control traffic in the parking lot. He had 'runners' who would bring the fish dinners out to the customers in their cars.

The first two weeks were a challenge because cars were backed up on the road, in a "waiting in line". Our Worthy Treasurer John Robillard suggested that we redirect customers down to the St. James cemetery driveway and direct them up to the church from there. Brandon Parsons, who is a Knight, and a Whitehall Police Officer, was put in charge of setting up signs and cones and controlling traffic on the cemetery drive and church parking lot. This kept the cars from backing up on the road and eased the concerns of the local police department. Many other adjustments were made to keep up with customer demand and to deliver "Curb-side" meals efficiently. By the third week the "Curb-side" Fish Fry was running like a well-oiled machine.

Our PGK John Duff is our communications director. He published the Fish Fry on our church website and Facebook. The fish fry was also advertised in the church bulletin. PGK Steve Nagengast put Fish Fry advertising in the White Lake Beacon, our local newspaper.

Our priest, Rev. Fr. Peter Omogo, is one of our best supporters. He will often ask one of the KC members at Mass, each weekend, how many dinners we sold on Friday night. Fr. Peter will suggest to the that the congregation invite a friend or two to come to our next fish fry. Each weekend Fr. Peter can be heard setting a new goal of dinners to be sold for the upcoming Friday.

The number of dinners sold during Lent of 2021 started out low, but the numbers quickly increased.

Friday, Feb 12 = 360 dinners Friday, Feb 19 = 575 dinners Friday, Feb 26 = 636 dinners Friday, Mar 05 = 596 dinners Friday, Mar12 = 624 dinners Friday, Mar19 = 649 dinners Friday, Mar26 = 735 dinners Total = 4,175

The rest is history. The proceeds of our fish fry greatly exceeded my expectations.

Our customers come back every year because they can see the dedication in our team of "Fish Friers", to visit with friends and to enjoy a good meal. They come back because our fish dinners <u>are the best</u>.

Our Rev. Fr. Peter Omogo says that, "It takes a team work to make a dream work".

That is what happened here. A team of loyal "Fish Friers" came together, with good leadership, to pull off another successful fish fry. The revenue generated helps us to do Gods work in supporting his priests, church, our community, and people near and far.




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"We have online ordering, and it's all computerized," Tom Bart, fish fry leader for the Knights of Columbus, said. "You just go online with your charge card and order. Then, when you come here, we park you at a designated post. Text us to tell us where you are, and we bring your food out to you. We have volunteer runners that are really running to get your food. That's how it's set up differently, and it's a hard job. It's really hard changing from what we've been doing for 28 years."

A test run was done last week, and everything went fine, Bart said. He added that 100% of the proceeds get distributed to those in need. All told, more than a dozen local charities will benefit from the weekly event which runs from 4:30 to 7 p.m. every Friday through the end of March.



Every Friday through March 26, curbside pick-up fish fry dinners will be available at St. James Catholic Church, 5149 Dowling St. in Montague. The curbside pick-up hours will be from 4:30-7 p.m. and the cost is \$13 for adult meals. There are no kids meal this year. Fish choices include freshwater perch, freshwater walleye, breaded farm raised shrimp, combos perch/shrimp and walleye/shrimp. Each dinner also includes a baked potato or French fries, coleslaw or applesauce, dinner role and dessert. Extra pieces: walleye \$3, perch \$2 and shrimp are two for \$3.
