The need of the project was the city had asked that the property needed to be cleaned up and repairs done to the house. This project resolved the needs of the wheelchair bound property owner and city.


3d) Why did the council select this project?

OVERVIEW

Project "David"

There was no real long term planning for this project. This project started with a phone call to Saint Thomas the Apostle church office asking how to get a hold of the Knights of Columbus. At that point the church secretary contacts me, Grand Knight of Immaculate Conception Council. I took the information and contacted the person.

I talked with a person that has a brother named David that lives in Garden City, Michigan (where we are located) who is wheel chair bound and needed help with his house. The city said that there are items that need to be addressed at the property a new roof, siding, trim, gutters, yard work. They had run low on funds after installing a new roof and gutters and asked if the Knights could help clean-up the yard, siding and trim.

It was the Knights answering a call from the Lord. It just so happens that I am a licensed and insured construction contractor. We brought it up at the next council meeting it was voted on to proceed with project "David". A couple of days after that council meeting I was contacted by an anonymous person. After speaking with that person I was asked how they would go about in helping fund the project. I explained that if they could make the funding for the materials costs the Knights would supply the labor, we agreed.

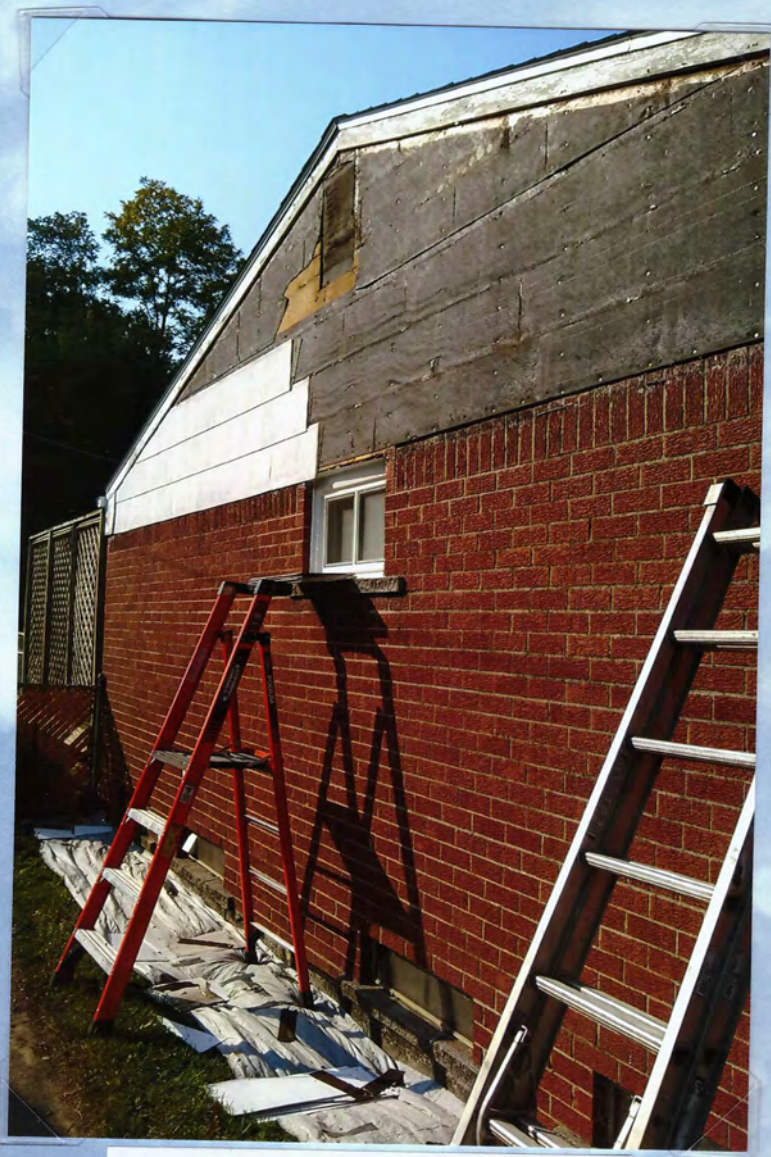

Faith in Action

Brothers Knights

With the Covid19 situation severely impacting all councils in the state, it is important that we all find ways to continue to do the good works of our order. It is more than simply learning how to conduct virtual meetings and switching from sit-down dinners to carry out. Our Faith is the most important thing and we cannot 'cancel' that. Last month on our state website I talked a bit about the 'Spiritual Reflection' program and how important it is for us to pray together, if not physically together. Retreats seem out of the question at this time however getting together virtually will work...do not discard the idea. However, for those who would rather wait and be involved in a more conventional retreat, a series of men's retreats will be coming out in 2021 - "maybe" beginning in April. The content of the retreats will be very spiritual, relevant to us as Knights, and will be small in size & scope. We are not looking to break the bank of Monte Carlo rather we are looking for strong participation so stay tuned and watch the state website for information on times and locations.

With regards to other Faith programs, now more than ever Councils need to find ways to be involved with:

Sacramental Gifts - Support families during the most important events in the life of the domestic church, the sacraments. Please review the program and become engaged.

Rosary Program - an absolute given that the Knights of Columbus promote praying the rosary regularly in our families and our parishes.

Holy Hour - Similar to 'Spiritual Reflection' during a time of pandemic restrictions - can lend itself well to a virtual environment. Regularly scheduled 'Holy Hours' are essential to who we are as Knights of Columbus.

Building the Domestic Church Kiosk - The good news is every council is involved with this program! Keep up the good work and promote it to the parish every now and again. This is such a lovely program for families!

Refund Support Vocations Program - the state is doing very well! What we should be most proud of is that there are 19 councils, and counting (as of 11/19/2020), that are supporting a seminarian or postulate who have not done so in the three years. That is fantastic! Now is the time for everyone to get onboard supporting a Seminarian or Postulate. Does your council need help getting started or have questions on how the program works? Reach out to

your District Deputy or myself - we are here to help you with these programs.



Into the Breach - During Covid19 lockdown use a virtual implement the **Into the Breach Video Series**. The **Video** is now available (#11059) - have your Financial Secretary (FSC) ASAP - they are free and well done!

Pilgrim ICON Program - In January 2021 the ICON program was formally known as the 'Marion ICON' but has been renamed this year to reflect a change in theme. The 'Michael the Archangel' which is very appropriate and great for our world today. Soon I will be reaching out to all District Deputies regarding routes and schedules. Any District Deputy who will be hosted by parishes in his district please let me know ASAP to get scheduled because this program does require a measure of cooperation with parishes and between districts. For example, you are already in the queue and will be the first in the Detroit District to travel to the four parishes of that district before traveling to another district.

Project "David"

HOURS:

- 1 Meet with owner go over colors and material to be used on project, get approval.
- 7 Pick up material, setup job to start work.
- 6 Bend aluminum trim rear overhand of house.
- 5.5 Bend aluminum trim for front overhand, install vinyl soffit.
- 2.5 Bend aluminum trim fascia front of house, remove old siding right sides gable.
- 2 Remove old siding left side gable.
- 5.5 Bend aluminum trim for return, install start strips for siding.
- 7 Bend aluminum trim for right side gable rake.
- 2.5 Bend aluminum trim for left side gable rake.
- 14 Vinyl side gables. 3.5 hours: times 4 men.
- 4 Install last 3 pieces of siding that was short, clean-up project finished.
- 24 Clean property of over growth at fence line, trim shrubs. 8 hours: times 3 men.

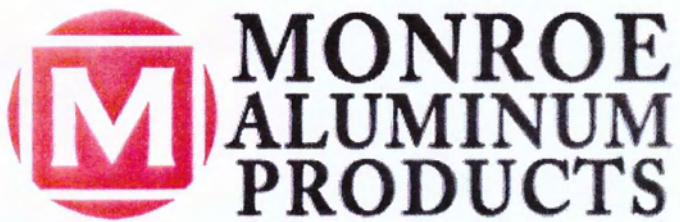
