Please find enclosed our State Council Program Award Entry Form and other documentation to support our Council's desire to be considered for the Fraternal Year 2022 Community Service Award.

The Council was informed that Brother Knight Tucker (Tom) & Mandy Diroff's three-month old grandson, Elliott Belair, was diagnosed with a very rare brain cancer known as Atypical Rhabdoid Tumor or ATRT. He had surgery at four weeks old with 90% of the tumor being removed. He is now undergoing chemotherapy, for approximately a year or longer. This will be a very long and tumultuous fight for Elliott and his parents, Adam and Natalie Belair.

Several of our Members took a special interest in this Family's situation and immediately started discussing ideas on how the Council could help. Shortly thereafter, the Fundraiser for Baby Elliott campaign was born with unanimous acceptance and support by the Officers, Members and families.

It was decided to initiate a couple fundraisers to help the Family defray their medical costs and provide emotional support and ask for God's blessing along the way. The first fundraising event was a Euchre Tournament where the bulk of the proceeds went to the Family. The second was a basket raffle where 100% of the proceeds would benefit the Family. Over 60 baskets were donated by our gracious Members and their families and members of the community who simply wanted to contribute. The baskets filled the Member Lounge and lit up the room during the 2021 holiday season and served as an important reminder to all of our Members of God's Grace and the true meaning of being a Knight.

Collectively, the Council raised \$11,000 for Baby Elliott and the Family. I am proud of our committed men and women who accomplished such a successful event in order to provide much needed financial relief to this family.

On behalf of all the Members of our Fr. Saylor Council, I thank you for accepting our application and for your consideration as all entries undergo processing for a final selection.

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Meet Baby Elliott Belair



Elliott Belair was born on July 17, 2021 to parents **Natalie and Adam Belair**. On Wednesday, August 18th, one-month-old baby Elliott was admitted to the hospital. His parents, took him in thinking he could possibly have a respiratory infection as he had a lot of congestion and mucus, along with a few other symptoms, but they were sadly mistaken.

In the ER that night, the doctor noticed some swelling on his head and a CT scan revealed a large amount of fluid in the brain along with a large mass. Elliott was then transferred to C.S. Mott Children's Hospital in Ann Arbor where he received an MRI which confirmed the heartbreaking news that it was indeed a tumor. He immediately went into emergency brain surgery.

After two hours of fluid draining and eight hours of brain surgery to remove the tumor, the neurosurgeon was able to extract about 90% of the tumor, but the rest of it was too entangled in the brain stem and tissue to safely take out any more without causing permanent damage. Elliott went to the PICU to recover while waiting to discover what type of tumor and cancer

he was battling. He was kept on a ventilator and his parents were unable to hold him for several days.

In the days following surgery, Elliott was able to have the ventilator removed and was placed on low oxygen via a nasal cannula. Due to the congestion and the fact that he had some recovery to do when it comes to swallowing and healing of his vocal cords, he was placed on a feeding tube. His external ventricular drain (for draining the remaining fluid from the brain) was removed on August 25th and Natalie and Adam were finally able to hold and snuggle their sweet, brave boy.

A week after the surgery, the pathology results came back on the tumor and it was not the news they were hoping and praying to hear. "Elliott the Fighter" has been diagnosed with Atypical Teratoid Rhabdoid Tumor (ATRT) which is a very rare, aggressive, and fast-growing cancerous tumor of the brain and spinal cord.

Elliott's medical team discussed options and received input from other knowledgeable doctors and institutions around the country to devise the best treatment plan for him to fight and beat this.



Elliott had surgery to place his central line (broviac) for chemotherapy and to put in a G-Tube for his feeds since he is often unable to eat orally. He also has regular physical and occupational therapy, which will continue for years.

On September 14, 2021 Elliott started his first round of chemotherapy. The IRS-III protocol is very aggressive and lasts at least 52 weeks, if not longer. In December, the family received great news that the MRI detected no tumor, however, cancer cells may still exist and the planned chemotherapy treatments need to stay in place in order to kill any further cells. While this is great news, this is a very aggressive cancer and often reoccurs with a vengeance, which is why the hospital team want to finish the entire chemotherapy protocol.

This is a long road and something Elliott and his parents will be dealing with his entire life. As of March 15, 2022, Elliott has completed seven of the 17 rounds of chemotherapy.

He usually needs to be hospitalized for the chemo treatments and often afterwards for side effects. He gets very ill during the treatments and immediately afterwards when his blood counts drop. He has endured yet another surgery for a brain bleed and to place the ommaya port in his head for the chemotherapy, to allow the chemo to cross brain barriers and attack the tumor right into the brain via the top of his head.



Impact to the Community

The entire community has pulled together for this family from cities all around. clothing to books and toys. Total strangers have donated money. Friends and family in other states have donated funds. Many, many people have contacted the family to let them know they are praying and have added Elliott to their church prayer list. It's been heartwarming to see so many come together for this little fighter.





Impact to the Family

The funds received from this event have gone directly to the family. They use the funds to offset costs not covered by medical insurance. These include but are not limited to the following: bills, additional medical supplies, special clothing, tools/items for therapy, gas for trips to and from the hospital, and meals for the parents during monthly hospital stays.

The emotional impact for this family has been real. During these COVID days, there has been limited visitation for one grandparent, then none at all with the recent variant. This means no additional help for the parents. In addition to caring for Elliott, the parents are maintaining their jobs virtually while at the hospital or at home. The struggle is real.

The following is a statement from the family:

To say that we as a family have felt an emotional impact is an understatement. Each of us—Elliott's parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles and other extended family near and far—have been grateful beyond words, and overwhelmed by not only this entire event, but by the continued kindness, generosity, and concern from the entire Knights of Columbus community, to the point of tears for most of us. We all are truly thankful for the financial assistance, but knowing we have this kind of support and continued prayers, gives us all, especially Natalie and Adam, the hope and strength we continue to need on a daily basis.
