Attached, please find our Family of the Year Entry Form and other documentation in support of our desire to have the Salter Family considered for the Family of the Year Award, for the 2023 Fraternal Year.

On October 16, 2002, several months after Mike Salter became an O'Kelley Knight, he and his wife Ellen, and their three young children Lauren, Michael, and Shannon welcomed into their family Meghan Marie Salter – a completely healthy baby girl.

Within a few months, Meghan's health began to quickly deteriorate. She suffered multiple seizures and physical collapses requiring several Survival Flights to the University of Michigan C.S. Mott Children's Hospital. Soon Meghan could not physically move, eat or breathe on her own. At five months old, she was given a tracheostomy and placed on a ventilator that allowed her to breathe. By six months old, a feeding tube was surgically placed into Meghan's stomach to provide daily nourishment. After a full week of testing at the Mayo Clinic in Minnesota, the doctors declared Meghan "a medical mystery." She is totally dependent upon her loving family and the grace of God for her very life. Meghan remains undiagnosed and lives at home in Dearborn, Michigan where she and her family are active members at the Church of the Divine Child.

The Salter Family and nurses provide twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week care for Meghan. Therefore, our Brother Mike has not held any positions within the Council. However, he heroically Champions his family while Ellen advocates locally, nationally and even internationally for the Pro-Life and Right to Life Movements.

Therefore, when Mike was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in July, 2023 and immediately offered his condition to our Lord's care, he skyrocketed to the top of everyone's Prayer List – right next to Meghan.

It is the hope of the O'Kelley Council that this exceptional Catholic Family be recognized so their story may be become even more widespread, and prayers for Mike and Meghan may flourish.



The Salter's are the ultimate defenders of life, beginning with her own daughter Meghan who cannot speak or even breathe on her own. Although Meghan has been on life support for nearly her whole life, she has touched thousands who attribute conversions and even miracles to her.

"Everyone has a gift," Ellen Salter tells audiences as a highly sought after Catholic Speaker. *"Meghan's gift is saving souls."*

While others look on in wonder and some question the value of Meghan's life, Ellen reveals what a gift the disabled, weak, and vulnerable are to us. She transfixes audiences by sharing God's revelation to her before Meghan was even born and how joining the difficulties to the cross of Christ has brought their family comfort and joy.

"Meghan cannot hold a doll, she will never go to school. Though she can't move her body, this does not mean Meghan is less of a human being. She has a soul," Salter says. "Souls can never be destroyed."

Salter, who has a college degree, decided to be a stay-at-home mom for her first three children and is the main caregiver for her youngest daughter, though everyone in their family shares in the care. Her favorite part of the day is holding and rocking Meghan. Her daughter may not be able to speak, but Salter said Meghan is able to communicate, including smacking her lips when she wants a kiss.

Praising Right to Life, Salter said the organization gave her family guidance and support, not legal options as some in the medical profession had done. She urged the gathering to raise their voices in support of the sanctity of human life.

"She knows how to love. Meghan has a heart of gold. She is a pure joy for us," Salter said.

"She may not look perfect to you or to anyone else, but she is not disposable. She has tremendous value, as witnessed to all who lay their eyes on her."

Calling her family a "*Right to Life family*," Salter said they are a very loving, close-knit group that believes in miracles.

"You never know who God is going to put in your path. I thank God every day for Meghan," she said. "This precious gift is very humbling."

And in the "Religion Category," the winner of the Emmy is ... Audrey Sommers for Stories of Faith: Meghan's Miracle!

Applause, applause, as the Emmy Awards got something really right a few weeks ago at the 34th National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences Michigan Chapter ceremonies. The academy gave the Emmy to Sommers for her moving film of family love, courage, prayer and conversion. *Stories of Faith: Meghan's Miracle* aired on EWTN on Aug. 15, 2011. It was also shown on the Archdiocese of Detroit's cable station, CTND.

The truly touching and inspiring story of the Salter Family and their 8-year-old daughter Meghan, who can't speak and who needs 24-hour care, but who has brought countless souls back to prayer and to Jesus, appeared here before the film aired.

So when a story like this gets a major award, there's a light shining on what television could be and should be.

Sommers knows because she has worked not only behind the camera, but in front of it, too. She was once a news anchor at a Detroit TV station. During that time, she was nominated several times for an Emmy for her work on crime stories.

"After 20-some years in secular media, I had submitted so many entries, crime stories, for Emmy nominations while at a Fox affiliate," Sommers told me while talking about this Emmy win. But she never won. Until now.

Because God had other plans for her talents.

"It wasn't until I got into Catholic media that I started winning the awards," she emphasized. Sommers joined the staff of the *Michigan Catholic* newspape,r then the archdiocesan Catholic TV station in Michigan.

Sure enough, she picked up a couple of Telly Awards, plus another professional society award for a TV special called *Angels in the Caribbean*. It presented the work of Food for the Poor. The Telly Awards, which receives many thousands of entries from 50 states and five continents, is a premier award for outstanding film and video productions.

Then Sommers shot a TV show in Rome for World Youth Day 2000 that was another award winner.

As producer/writer/host of her own Sommers Productions, she then filmed *Meghan's Miracle*. This time, the Emmy nomination itself was a surprise. She recalls being in the library when she spotted online that she was nominated.

"I was crying; tears were coming down my eyes — for such a beautiful story like *Meghan's Miracle*," she said.

With a little speech in mind, just in case, she attended the red-carpet event in Detroit.

When they announced the title of my show, I jumped up, forgot grace and poise, went jumping up the steps, and put my whole speech aside," she said.

Beaming, she held the Emmy high.

"The first thing I blurted out was, 'Thank You, God! This one's for you!"

Sommers made sure to add that she sees this as an honor for Catholic television.

And Meghan shares in the Emmy, too.

Detroit's Catholic network did a two-week rerun of the program after the announcement. And, best of all, Meghan's story is reaching more people again. Watch it directly here on at Meghan's Miracles website, where you can learn more about Meghan and see many photos.

"Meghan brings people to the faith, and she brings people to prayer," Sommers says.

Sommers hopes this show will lead to a series of like-minded spiritual stories focusing on Catholics' faith through trials and tribulations.

She wants each show to confirm how God is working in the lives of people and families in their times of need and how their faith sustains them and even grows in these trials.

To film similar quality Catholic-themed programs, she needs to get the necessary sponsor or sponsors to help her (email her) in the work.

In the wings, there just might be another Emmy, along with all the inspiration.





Meghan came into the world on October 16, 2002. She was born without any apparent health problems. For the first three weeks, she ate, grew, slept and did everything a healthy, happy baby would do. Then, without warning in the second week of November, Meghan's health started to change.

Life is

After a series of unexplained selzures, Meghan no longer is able to move her arms or legs and is dependent on a ventilator. When she wakes from a long sleep, she will stretch her back. She also can move her head from side to side. And Meghan's smille lights up the room.

Through all the ups and downs of Meghan's medical challenges, her family continues to hope and pray.

Meghan is a daughter, a granddaughter, a sister, a niece and a friend. Her life has immeasurable value not only to those around her, but also because she is a precious and irreplaceable individual. Meghan's future is unclear – in reality, everyone's future is uncertain, but as members of the human family we have a responsibility to care for and to love each other. Meghan and her family teach us that life is love.

In conjunction with our Mother's Day Dinner, we are honoring our Mother of the Year 2007, Ellen Salter, of Dearborn. Ellen was nominated by her 13-year-old daughter, Lauren. Printed below is the nomination letter which her daughter wrote.


y name is Lauren Salter. I am 13 years old and the oldest of four children. I am nominating my mom for the 2007 Right to Life–LIFESPAN Mother of the Year award on behalf of myself, my brother, Michael, and my sisters, Shannon and Meghan.

My mom, Ellen Salter, is an amazing mother and deserves the title of "Mother of the Year." Before I tell you *why* she deserves this title, I'd like to

tell you how and when my mom and dad met. Their marriage was truly made in heaven. While attending college, they were introduced to each other by a priest while on the way to a retreat! They dated for about a year before getting engaged. They got married on April 24, 1992. My mom and dad quickly answered God's call to have children and I was born in August of 1993—a little over a year after my mom and dad were married. For two years, I had my mom and dad all to myself—until September 1995 when my younger brother, Michael, was born. Then, in August 1998, Shannon was born. We were a very happy family and did everything together, but my mother had more love to share—more love to give.

My mom loved children so much, she prayed for yet another baby. We found out recently that my mom wanted a fourth child so badly that she prayed that if God would grant her another baby, she would fully accept and love a baby that someone else might not want—a baby that might be aborted by someone else. It took four years, but her prayers were finally answered, and beautiful Meghan Marie came into this world on October 16, 2002. The *unconditional love* that my mother shows for Meghan, as well as her pro-life activism, is why I am nominating my amazing mom for the 2007 Right to Life – LIFESPAN Mother of the Year. Let me explain...

Meghan was born completely healthy, but within a few months, she got critically sick. She was getting progressively weaker and weaker. By the time she was four months old, she had stopped breathing and collapsed several different times in my mom's arms. Each time, my dad frantically called 9-1-1, and Meghan was taken by ambulance to the local hospital, then airlifted to U of M Mott Children's Hospital in Ann Arbor. It was very scary since we had no notice when these "collapses" would occur and none of the doctors could tell us why these incidents happened in the first place. Poor Meghan was hospitalized for most of 2003. She went through an enormous amount of testing to find out the cause of her illness, but to this day remains undiagnosed. During this time in the hospital, Meghan was given a tracheotomy and was put on a ventilator to help her breathe. A feeding tube was also placed into her stomach, allowing Meghan to receive the nourishment she needs. *continued on page* 3.






