When the word got out, several Brother Knights went over to Jason's farm to help his wife Jill and offer assistance. This was a huge shock to the family, friends and the community of Mason. In addition to helping on the farm, our council gave Mrs. McMahon a check for \$500.00 from our Family Relief Emergency Fund to help with immediate expenses.

At Jason's funeral, a group of Brother Knights talked how they could help the family, particularly with the Education Expenses for the children, Wyatt and Grace. This was when they came up with the idea for a pig roast. Jason had always Home Schooled both children but now they face the extra cost of tutition to one of the local Catholic Schools plus transportation and other education expenses. Assistance with higher education is also a possiblity and will be determined later.

At the next Knight's Council Meeting on September 24th, it was proposed that the council conduct a pig roast to fund the children's education fund. Father Kusitino Cobona, pastor of the Catholic Community of St. James, Cornelius and Cyprian, was asked if he would support the project and allow us to use the hall and he enthusiastically agreed. The first planning meeting was held on September 28th under the direction of Jeff Haueter and Chris Knudstrup. Assignments were given to the committee members and sign up sheets were developed and provide for their use. A sponsorship program and board were developed for the workers with the plan to have all of the food and products needed to be paid for by the sponsors. It was decided to have a silent auction and well as a live auction. Committee members were assigned to develop flyer's to advertise the event and solicit items for the live and silent auctions. They also proceeded with plans to have a live band, hayride and bonfire, corn hole games and a raffle. Once the flyer's were ready, they were placed in area businesses and Churches announcing the event and soliciting donations. Church bulletin announcements and pulpit announcements also took place. Funds and donations started to flow in from our generous community. Plans continued and the event started to really shape up.

On November 4, 2023, the event took place. Early in the morning the pig was loaded into the roaster. Brother Knights, Knights Angels, parishioners and family members started working in the kitchen and hall preparing the food and setting up tables and chairs and the serving line. The tables were decorated with pictures of Jason's farm activities, his equipment and family members. The bonfire was started, corn hole was set up, live and silent auction items were displayed. The live band was set up and played throughout dinner and then later for dancing. The event started with the 4 PM Mass. When Mass ended, it was time for dinner. Over 400 meals were served either sit down or take home. The cost for the dinner was a free will offering and totaled over \$7,700.00 for the meals. When dinner was completed the live auction took place and generated \$10,000.00. Then the hayrides, bonfire and corn hole started right after the live auction. The raffle brought in \$2,200.00 and the silent auction brought in \$2,600.00. The initial sponsorships brought in almost \$10,000.00.

In conclusion, on December 17, 2023, Mason Council 9182 and friends were honored to present Jill and her family with a check for \$30,000.00 for the McMahon Educational Fund for Wyatt and Grace. This event took many of members, non-members, family and the entire community to make it so successful. What a way for the Catholic Community of St. James, Cornelius and Cyprian, the Knights and the entire community to come together in a time of disaster and grief.

Introduction

Gone!

In our Exemplification Ceremonial, we are taught the perpetual watchwords "Tempus Fugit, Memento Mori". It means time flies, remember death. We do not know the day, nor the hour, that we will be called to give an account of our life.

On September 7, 2023, Mason Council 9182 lost one of our brother knights in a tragic farm accident, Jason McMahon. Jason loved farming and was doing his morning chores when he was attacked by one of his own bulls. What a terrible shock to his family, his friends, our community and our Council.

Once the word got out, Mason Council 9182 stepped up to help Jason's wife, Jill, with some of the farm chores. Several brother knights went to the farm to help and offer other assistance. Our Council decided to assist the family with a \$500.00 check from our budgeted Family Emergency Relief Fund to help with immediate expenses.

The Mass of Christian Burial was held on September 13, 2023, with our Chaplain Fr. Kusitino Cobona officiating. The service was very well attended in support of the family after this devasting tragedy. At the funeral dinner, several Brother Knights were sitting together and talked about how they and our council could help the family. They quickly came up with an idea for a pig roast to establish an Education Fund for the two children, Wyatt and Grace.

Fr. Kusitino Cobona, Chaplain and Priest at the Catholic Community of Sts. James, Cornelius and Cyprian Parish, was asked for his support and he totally agreed to the project and offered his support.

At the next Knight's meeting on September 24, the idea was brought up and met with overwhelming support. The first committee meeting was held on September 28th with eleven Knights, Knights Angels and other parishioners present. Co-Chairman, PGK Jeff Haueter presented an agenda for the meeting and had prepared various sign-up forms to use to get this project started. A plan was established and those in attendance were given assignments for various parts of the project.

Three additional committee meetings were held and more people were brought into the committee. A pig and other pork products were donated. A signup sheet including all of the food and products needed to complete the pig roast was developed including suggested donation amounts. It was our intent that all of the food and product expenses would be covered by sponsor donations and not come out of the pig roast proceeds.

Plans continued to include the pig roast dinner, games, hayride, bonfire, raffle, silent and live auctions, live band and lots of donation jars. Flyers were developed for distribution in the church and throughout the community. We were blessed that everything was developing as expected. Final plans were being made for the big event on November 4th right after the 4 o'clock Mass on the St. James Campus. It was amazing how this was accomplished in just 39 days.

The event served dinner to over 400 people with free will offering jars bringing in over \$7,700.00. The live auction, conducted by Brother Knight and Auctioneer Bill Sheridan, raised \$10,000.00. The Silent Auction totaled over \$2,600.00. and the Raffle was another \$2,200.00. Board Sponsorships and Anonymous donations accounted for the final \$10,000.00.

When all was said and done, on December 17, 2023, Mason Council 9182 presented Jill McMahon and her family with a Check for \$30,000.00 to go towards the McMahon Education Fund for her children, Wyatt and Grace.

It was a huge project but with many hands including family, friends, parishioners, Knights and local community members, this wonderful event was accomplished.

Man, 44, killed in 'tragic' Vevay Township farm accident

VEVAY TWP. — A 44-year-old Mason man died Thursday in an apparent farm accident, police said.

The Ingham County Sheriff's Office responded to a call for a man "injured and down" in a field at a farm in the 1700 block of West Columbia Road, near Ives Road, about 6:22 p.m. and were led to "an area occupied by large animals," sheriff's officials said in a news release.

The man was pronounced dead at the scene.

"This incident appears to be a tragic accident, (and) no foul play is suspected," officials said.

The release said the ICSO was conducting an investigation in conjunction with the medical examiner's office. No other details about the incident were released.

Jason McMahon Obituary

Jason McMahon, age 44, of Mason, Michigan, passed away on September 7, 2023, after an unexpected and tragic farming accident. Jason was born in Saginaw, Michigan, on June 24, 1979, the son of Joseph and Diane McMahon, who are surviving. He graduated from Hemlock High School and Kettering University and excelled in his career as a mechanical engineer. Jason retired early to build a small farm for his family focusing on healthy and sustainable eating with naturally fed livestock and organic gardening. Jason was a devoted husband to Jill and loving father to their two beautiful young children, Grace and Wyatt. He homeschooled his children teaching through experiential learning on the farm and in the community. Grace and Wyatt loved the way he taught, from the way he brought history to life with stories, teaching them "old school" math, to making Latin and Greek fun with decoding games. Jason loved God and his church. In addition to attending mass, Jason was a member of the Knights of Columbus and volunteered as a catechist - teaching kids the sacraments and sharing his faith in God. He was a dedicated volunteer coaching his kids' sports teams, teaching physical education to his home school cohort, coaching a robotics team, and working in the community garden. His inquisitive and mechanical mind helped develop his interest in antique tractors and traditional farming techniques as well as allowing him to fix just about anything including phones and lawn mowers. He will be greatly missed by his family - in the daily activities of going down the stairs in the mornings to make breakfast and reading bible stories with Wyatt and Grace in the evenings, to special events such as finding the perfect Christmas tree, hiding Easter baskets, and going to Mackinac Island. Jason will be remembered as an honest, patient, faithful, and hardworking man who loved his family.

In addition to his parents, Jason is survived by his wife of 12 years, Jill McMahon; children, Wyatt and Grace; siblings, Adam McMahon and Jennifer McMahon (Beau Rankin); Jill's siblings: Robert (Andrea) Slade, Michael Slade, Keli Fleming, Larry Slade, and Tommy (Amy) Slade; Jill's parents: Robert Slade, Meribeth and Jim Rightmire; and his nieces and nephews: Stella, Laila, Bridget, Cameron, Alex, Ethan, Nick, Vince, Bobby, Christopher, Logan and Jackson. He is preceded in death by his 1-year-old brother, Joseph McMahon.

The Catholic Community of Sts. James, Cornelius, and Cyprian are honored to host the services celebrating Jason's life at the St. James campus located at 1010 S. Lansing Street in Mason, Michigan. Please join Jason's family for the funeral mass at 11:00 a.m.on Wednesday, September 13, 2023, with Fr. Kusi Cobona officiating. The service will be livestreamed and can be accessed at the link on his tribute wall. Visitation will be held on Tuesday, September 12 from 4-7 p.m. with a rosary service immediately following at 7 p.m. Visitation will also be held on Wednesday beginning at 10 a.m. prior to the service. Jason will be laid to rest at Maple Grove Cemetery following the service. So God made a farmer.

God said, "I need somebody strong enough to clear trees and heave bails, yet gentle enough to tame lambs and wean pigs and tend the pink-combed pullets, who will stop his mower for an hour to splint the broken leg of a meadow lark." It had to be somebody who'd plow deep and straight and not cut corners. Somebody to seed, weed, feed, breed and rake and disc and plow and plant and tie the fleece and strain the milk and replenish the self-feeder and finish a hard week's work with a five-mile drive to church. "Somebody who'd bale a family together with the soft strong bonds of sharing, who would laugh and then sigh, and then reply, with smiling eyes, when his son says he wants to spend his life 'doing what dad does.'

An open letter to the public written by Jason's widow, Jill McMahon.



"The seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understand it."

My family is so very grateful for all the memories shared and support that has been poured out from the communities near and far. I want to share with you that while we are very heartbroken and will be forever changed because of his death, Jason lived a truly blessed life and a full life. While he had many dreams yet to fulfill, he was living his dream life, his best life.

He dreamed of a farm life for himself and his family for which he delivered above and beyond. He was self-taught in raising jersey cows to provide milk, butter, and cheese for the family. He learned how to manage our pastures to nourish our animals through traditional planting and harvesting techniques. He bred and raised a heritage hog (GOS) cross yielding the cutest squealing pink spotted piglets, while providing the best pork I ever had in my life. His harvests also yielded produce nearly year-round from carrots dug from the soil between November and March and fresh potatoes enjoyed from August to March. Together we harvested squash, lettuces, pumpkins, and all possible vegetables that can be grown in Michigan. We canned beets, beans, salsa, pickles, tomatoes, apples, and jam and stocked the freezer with fresh corn, peas, peaches, and asparagus. His harvests yielded navy and black beans as well as cornmeal and popcorn. He was known to plant in row lengths of 50', usually between 3 and 5 rows, just to be sure we had a big enough yield. He harvested honey from our bees and maple syrup from our trees. He built an enormous chicken coup providing fresh eggs year-round. He raised beautiful and sustaining turkeys over the years. He built a smoker for our meat which was enjoyed by many at our Pig Roasts. He continuously worked to keep our tractors are various machines and implements running and functioning.

He was determined to find meaning in all parts of living a traditional life well beyond "farm to table". Jason lived a life of virtue and has passed along more wisdom to his children than most receive in a full lifetime. He lived by and believed in God our father and centered our lives and experiences on faith and commitment. He was a brilliant engineer with a true gift of logic. Faced with any number of challenges, with hard work, grit, and determination, he found solutions and teaching opportunities in each experience. He modeled and enjoyed hard work and found enormous value in labor and being truly connected to the richness of the soil. He designed and mastered a home school curriculum that our children fell in love with. He has also given our children gifts of inquisition, creativity, and patience.

Our children respected and loved their generous father and teacher all the days of his life. While we are very early in the process of healing and grieving, I want to let everyone know that the children are beaming with life and showing amazing resilience. May the Lord continue to give us strength.

Thank you for the prayers and support. We love you all so much and Jason, we all miss you tremendously.






