Your Unworthy State Chaplain



I have spoken about this a few times over the years, but I firmly believe that it deserves a wider audience. I hate it when I am referred to as "Worthy State Chaplain." Mind you, I do not hate being the State Chaplain. Rather, it is the opinion that I am "worthy" that I despise.

I am deeply aware that I am unworthy. I am unworthy of my baptism, my confirmation, my ordination, every confession and Eucharist I have celebrated and received. I am unworthy of my ministry at Lansing Catholic High School, to the Knights of Columbus, and to the Diocese of Lansing. I am unworthy of the very air that I breathe this second. And I further know that my unworthiness is my crown, and that no one shall hurl me from my throne without a fight.

If I had to be somehow worthy of all of these things, of every gift, grace, and blessing in my life, I would drive myself insane. Imagine trying to earn the love of your family and friends. Imagine having to deserve the right to see the beauty of a sunrise. Imagine having to state your case as to why you should be allowed to laugh at a joke. How could one possibly be worthy of any of singular piece of it, let alone all of it together? But it is right there, in the unworthiness, that something remarkable happens.

Deep in the brokenness I find in myself, there is another person lurking about. The person of Jesus comes to me, not in spite of my unworthiness, but precisely because of it. In my unworthiness, I find that I am in need of a savior. And in Jesus, I discover that I actually have one. Jesus is not some pleasant platitude, not some philosophical construct, not some psychosomatic delusion, nor crazy superstition. He is the Savior, and He meets us there in the reality of our tangled and wounded hearts. He really comes. He really speaks. He really saves.

Therein lies all of my glory. Not that I am worthy, but that He makes me worthy. As I press further and further into Him, He elevates me more

We must continue to work to replace ourselves allowing us to continue our important work that we are known for. As we are always stronger when we work together.

Forms Forms and Awards Programs

We should remember forms are ways to know what we are doing in the Great Jurisdiction of Michigan. Forms are also needed to achieve awards for the work your members do throughout the year. Here is just some:

Supreme Star Council Award

The Supreme Star Council Award recognizes outstanding achievement in membership, insurance and service program activities. To be eligible to earn a Supreme Star Council Award, a Council must qualify for all three awards (Columbian Award, Father McGivney Award and Founders' Award).

To qualify for these awards, a Council must have submitted its Survey of Fraternal Activity (#1728) and its Service Program Personnel Report (#365). The Council must also be in good standing with the Supreme Council. Other eligibility requirements are listed under Columbian Award, Father McGivney Award and Founders' Award.

Councils must conduct and report at least four major programs in each service program category of Faith, Family, Community, and Life. With a minimum of 4 of these be designated as Building the Domestic Church. Upon projected completion of these requirements, complete and submit Supreme form #SP-7.

The Service Program Awards

Each year the Michigan State Council recognizes the best program in each of the Service Program areas; Faith, Family, Community and Life at the annual Michigan State Council convention.

A team of judges chosen by the State Deputy awards the top prize in each category to the winning Council at their state convention. The winning entries are then endorsed by the State Deputy and submitted to the Supreme Council office by June 10 for judging to determine the International Service Program Award Winners.

Total funds collected will be presented to Mgsr. Todd :Lajiness, Dean of S.H.M.S. at the Archbishops Gala in June, 2019

Our financial target for the Archbishops Gala presentation is \$300,000. If you have not sent in your contribution for the **E.S.F**. please submit the \$6 dollars or more to your council Financial Secretary. Councils are encourage to donate funds from Fish Fries, Breakfast's, or Vocations Funds to the Endowed Scholarship Fund as well.

The \$1,000,000 total donation agreed to by the State Board (representing the membership of Michigan) can be reached in 3-4 years if all members contribute \$6.00 per year or more.

The E.S.F. is a financial resource to assist seminarians in their total

cost of formation towards their required tuition, housing, etc. Annual scholastic cost can range from \$40,000 to \$50,000 per seminarian.

"Delta Drives"

The "Delta Drive" concept has been shared with us from our partners at Supreme as updated method of hosting a church drive or a parish campaign to make the process easier to conduct and to increase the positive results.

A new concept, the "Delta Drive" builds on the updated methods of hosting a church drive or a parish campaign to make the process easier to conduct and to increase the positive results. The program in the attachment has been tested and shown to be easy to use and effective in introducing men, especially younger men to our Order.

The purpose of the Delta Drive is to have technology work for you and your councils in a new approach to attract younger members. Using the Delta approach, we are relying in part on an effective pulpit speech and brochures in the church pews to share our message with the addition of a web page and e-mail contact.

After getting the prospects name and email information during the Delta Drive and entering this information in a "landing page" provided to your council by Supreme for this specific event, the prospect will receive emailed information from Supreme about the Knights of Columbus story. Additionally, the council will have email sent to inform the prospect of events happening at the council-level and how to set up a time to learn more about the local council.

The prospects will continue to receive information on a weekly basis about who we are as Knights and how your Council makes a difference in your parishes and your communities.

There is a kit needed for the Delta drive and this is NOT the traditional church drive kit available to order from Supreme. These new kits are only available by contacted our Supreme Regional Training Director Jon Olson at: jon.olson@kofc.org

He will show you how to request your prospect landing page and explain how the prospect will get personalized information from Supreme. 

KNIGHTHOOD DEGREE CHALLENGE

Worthy District Deputies, it was announced at the Winter DD Meeting that the State would conduct a Knighthood Challenge. We know that we have many First Degree Members in our Councils. Some where around 40% on the average are only First Degree Members. We are really depriving our First Degree Knights of learning the lessons of the Formation and Knighthood Degrees. It is the job of the District Deputy, Grand Knights and others to ask these men to become a Third Degree Member.

To get these Knights to FULL Knighthood, the State will conduct this challenge to all DD's that have a Major Degree from now until May1, 2019. So if you have a degree scheduled after May 1, 2019 and want to be part of the challenge, contact the State Ceremonial Director to change your Major Degree to before May 1, 2019. Check the Web-Site for availability dates in your area.

The winner of a FREE Wednesday night stay on May 22nd at the Grand Hotel for the State Convention and dinner with the Degree Staff, will be the Host District Deputy that has the most Candidates that go through the Knighthood Degree. The Host DD is the one that turns in a Major Degree Request to the State Ceremonial Director. If a tie, the State Ceremonial Director will call those tied DD's to determine the winner which will be based on which DD comes closest to a pre-determined number from 1 to 100.

Top 5 Questions You've Wanted to Ask About K of C Insurance

1. How does K of C life insurance work?

By purchasing a K of C life insurance policy and paying premiums you ensure that when you die, your beneficiary (or beneficiaries) will receive a lump sum, also known as a death benefit.

Step 1 — Maintain your council's website.

You should also provide a link to the Online Membership Application at kofc.org/ joinus to make joining even easier.


